We have audited the annexed balance sheet of HABIB UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION (incorporated as a company limited by guarantee not having share capital) as at 30 June 2012 and the related income and expenditure account, cash flow statement and statement of changes in funds together with the notes forming part thereof, for the year then ended and we state that we have obtained all the information and explanations which, to the best of our knowledge and belief, were necessary for the purposes of our audit.

 - the expenditure incurred during the year was for the purpose of the Foundation's business; and
 - the business conducted, investments made and the expenditure incurred during the year were in accordance with the objects of the Foundation;
- c) in our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the balance sheet, income and expenditure account, cash flow statement and statement of changes in funds together with the notes forming part thereof conform with approved accounting standards as applicable in Pakistan, and, give the information required by the Companies Ordinance, 1984, in the manner so required and respectively give a true and fair view of the state of the Foundation's affairs as at 30 June 2012 and the results of its operations, its cash flows and changes in Funds for the year then ended; and

HABIB UNIVERSITY FOUNDATION (INCORPORATED AS A COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE) NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 2012

1. LEGAL STATUS AND NATURE OF BUSINESS

The Habib University Foundation (the Foundation) was incorporated in Pakistan as a company limited by guarantee not having share capital under section 42 of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 on October 10, 2007. The Foundation is principally engaged in establishing a research-based university which will focus on Science, Engineering, Social Science and Entrepreneurship. The Foundation is also engaged in managing a vocational training institute for enhancing marketable skills for the youth to increase youth employability, and various other philanthropic projects that facilitate access to quality education. The Foundation has also undertaken various youth development projects in collaboration with Government of Sindh with an aim to improve the quality of educational programs in the country. The city campus of the university is currently under construction and it is anticipated that the university will start its first cohort from fall 2014. Construction at the main campus has not yet started.

2. BASIS OF MEASUREMENT

These financial statements have been prepared on the basis of historical cost convention.

3. STATEMENT OF COMPLIANCE

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with approved accounting standards, as applicable in Pakistan. Approved accounting standards comprise of Accounting and Financial Reporting Standard for "Medium-Sized Entities (MSEs)" issued by the Institute of Chartered Accountants of Pakistan and provisions of and directives issued under the Companies Ordinance, 1984. In case requirements differ, the provisions or directives of the Companies Ordinance, 1984 shall prevail.

4. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

4.1 Significant accounting judgments, estimates and assumptions

The preparation of the Foundation's financial statements requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of revenues, expenses, assets and liabilities, and the disclosure of contingent liabilities, at the end of the reporting period. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in future periods. Estimates and judgments are continually evaluated and are based on historical experience, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

In the process of applying the accounting policies, management has made the following estimates and judgments which are significant to the financial statements:

- (a) Determining the residual values and useful lives of property, plant and equipment (Note 4.2);
- (b) Determining the useful lives of intangible assets (Note 4.3);

(c) Impairment of assets (Note 4.16).

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4.2 Fixed assets and depreciation

4.2.1 Property, plant and equipment

Owned

Operating property, plant and equipment are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any, except for donated land and building, stated at fair value determined by an independent valuer less accumulated depreciation. The value assigned to the donated leasehold land is not depreciated where the lease is renewable at the option of the lessee.

Depreciation is charged to Income and expenditure account using straight line method so as to write off the historical cost of the assets over their estimated useful lives at the rates specified in Note 5.1. Depreciation on additions is charged for the full month in which an asset is put to use and on disposal upto the month immediately preceding the disposals. Assets residual values, useful lives and methods are reviewed and adjusted, if appropriate, at each financial year end.

The carrying values of property, plant and equipment are reviewed at each reporting date for indication that an asset may be impaired and carrying values may not be recovered. If any such indication exists and where the carrying values exceed the estimated recoverable amount, the assets or cash generating units are written down to their recoverable amount. The recoverable amount of property, plant and equipment is the greater of net selling price and value in use.

Maintenance and normal repairs are charged to Income and expenditure account as and when incurred. Major renewals and improvements, if any, are capitalized when it is probable that respective future economic benefits will flow to the Foundation.

An item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized upon disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use. Gains and losses are determined by comparing proceeds with the carrying amount of the relevant assets. These are included in the Income and expenditure account in the period in which they arise.

4.2.2 Capital work-in-progress

Capital work-in-progress is stated at cost less accumulated impairment losses, if any. It consists of expenditure incurred and advances made in respect of operating assets in the course of construction, installation and borrowing costs for qualifying assets if its recognition criteria are met. The cost under this head shall be transferred to operating fixed assets when the asset is available for use.

4.3 Intangible assets

An intangible asset is recognized if it is probable that the future economic benefits that are attributable to the asset will flow to the Foundation and that the cost of such asset can also be measured reliably.

Costs incurred on the acquisition of computer software are capitalized and are amortized on straight line basis over their estimated useful life. Amortization is charged in the month in which the asset is put to use at the rates stated in Note 6 to the financial statements.

Project development cost comprises of costs in relation to development of academic planning & modeling and networking & partnership frameworks. The frameworks are in development phase and for internal use. Development costs that are clearly defined and identifiable, where the technical utilization, sufficient resources and a potential market or development potential can be established and where there is an intention to produce, market or use the project, are recognized as an intangible asset. It includes costs directly attributable to the development of these assets. Following initial recognition of the development expenditure as an asset, the cost model will be applied requiring the amount to be carried at cost less any accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses. Capitalized development costs will be amortized on a straight-line basis over the period of expected future benefit from the date of completion / development of these assets and the asset is available for use.

Useful lives of intangible assets are reviewed, at each financial year end and adjusted if appropriate.

The carrying value of intangible assets is reviewed for impairment at each financial year end when events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying value may not be recoverable.

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4.4 Investments

Held-to-maturity

Non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturity are classified as held-to-maturity when the Company has the positive intention and ability to hold to maturity. Investments intended to be held for an undefined period are not included in this classification.

These investments are initially recognised at fair value plus transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition on the date the company commits to purchase. After initial recognition, these are recognised at amortized cost.

4.5 Loans, advances and other receivables

These are stated at cost less provision for doubtful balances, if any.

4.6 Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents are carried in the balance sheet at cost. For the purpose of cash flow statement, cash and cash equivalents comprise cash in hand, with banks on current and deposit accounts, other short-term highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less and running finance under mark-up arrangements.

4.7 Trade and other payables

Liabilities for trade and other payables are carried at cost which is the fair value of the consideration to be paid in future for the goods and services received, whether or not billed to the Foundation.

4.8 Employees' compensated absences

Compensated absences are accounted for on the basis of un-availed earned leave balance of each employee at the end of the year.

4.9 Taxation

The Foundation's income is exempt from income tax under section 2(36) (c) of the Income Tax Ordinance, 2001. Consequently, no provision for taxation has been made in these financial statements.

4.10 Provisions

Provisions are recognized when the Foundation has a present legal or constructive obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate of the amount can be made. Provisions are reviewed at each balance sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate.

4.11 Staff retirement benefits

The Foundation operates an approved contributory provident fund for all eligible employees. Equal monthly contributions are made by the Foundation and the employees to the fund at the rate of 8.33% of basic salary.

Contributions from Foundation are charged to income for the year.

4.12 Foreign currency translations

Foreign currency transactions are translated into Pak Rupees (functional currency) using the exchange rates prevailing at the dates of the transactions. Monetary assets and liabilities in foreign currencies are translated into Pak Rupees using the exchange rate at the balance sheet date. Foreign exchange gains and losses resulting from the settlement of such transactions and from the translations at the year end exchange rates of monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are taken to Income and expenditure account currently.

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4.13 Offsetting of financial assets and financial liabilities

A financial asset and a financial liability is only offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet if the Foundation has legally enforceable right to setoff the recognized amount and intends either to settle on a net basis or to realize the asset and settle the liability simultaneously. Income and expenses arising from such assets and liabilities are also offset accordingly.

4.14 Revenue recognition

(a) Donations

Donations in cash are recognized as income as and when received.

Donations in kind in the form of assets with no future related costs are recognized as income of the period in which it becomes receivable / received, at fair value determined by the independent valuers.

(b) Return on bank deposits

Return on term deposits and saving accounts is recognized on an accrual basis.

(c) Income from Youth Development Projects

Income related to youth development projects initiated in collaboration with Government of Sindh is recognized on a monthly basis equal to the amount of expenses incurred on behalf of the Government of Sindh.

4.15 Government grant

Government grants are recognized where there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attached conditions will be complied with. When the grant relates to an expense item, it is recognized as income over the period necessary to match the grant on a systematic basis to the costs that is intended to compensate. Grants received in the form of non monetary items are recorded at fair value and recognized as deferred income and released to income and expenditure account on a straight line basis over the useful lives of asset from the date the asset is available for internal use.

4.16 Impairment

The carrying amounts of the Foundation's assets are reviewed at each balance sheet date to determine whether there is any indication of impairment loss. If such indication exists, the asset's recoverable amount is estimated in order to determine the extent of the impairment loss, if any. Impairment losses are charged to income in the period in which they arise.
